Dear Sir:

Referring to your letter of the 27th ult., and to previous correspondence in regard to Clara Henault, you are informed that the letter of Mrs. Maggie Henault forwarded with your letter, was written by her son-in-law, Robert Hamilton, notwithstanding his denial.

The father and mother insist that they consented that she should remain for one year only, while Hamilton and her brother wanted the girl to remain for another term.

The mother is afflicted with rheumatism and will need the assistance of her daughter or some one else - specially as her daughter who lives in Spokane, and is now visiting her mother, expects soon to return to her home, taking with her her son, a young boy, who has been with his grand parents for some time.

The father states that they sent the girl to school for five years, and last year consented that she should remain for another year; that time has expired and he now insists that




she be returned home.

In the application for enrollment, forwarded with your letter and which is returned herewith, Clara states her age as fifteen. The Register of Indian Families in this office gives her age, in April, 1904, as sixteen. If this is correct, she should now be eighteen years old, and privileged to decide for herself whether or not she would return home.

I am of the opinion that it is not from affection that the father desires his daughter's return, but rather a selfish desire to obtain her services.

I agree entirely with you that it would be to the girl's detriment to return her to her home at this time.
