I worked out after I left Carlisle for about two months.

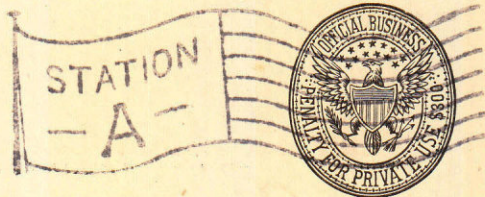
9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life:
