I have a good home and two children one age nine years, a girl who attends public school and is in the forth grade, the other a baby age 3 months.

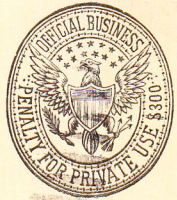
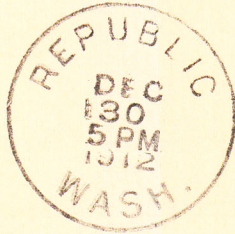
I will never forget dear old Carlisle and the esperance I gained while there, it has helped more then I can tell in my home. I would like to receive some of the school papers.

My dear Mrs. Keyes:-

I am in receipt of your letter relative to enrolling your daughter in this school. I am glad to know that after nearly twenty years, your interest in Carlisle is such, you want to enrol one of your children here, and give her the advantages you enjoyed as a pupil.

I should have been very glad to have taken your daughter if she had been interested in any other course than the Business Course. This was abolished several years ago.

I am taking the liberty of mailing you under separate cover, a copy of our catalog so that you and your daughter may look it over. Possibly you may find in the course laid out, something in the vocational line which would interest you both. If so, I will be glad to take up further the matter of your daughter's enrolment.

Indian parents who are able to pay tuition for their children attending government schools, should do so. The cost per annum would amount to \$200. This does not include her transportation which you would also have to pay, provided you come under this class. If you do not, the government would pay both tuition and transportation.

Mrs. Denny is still here and remembers you well. She sends her regards with the message that if you see fit to send your daughter to Carlisle, she will take a personal interest in her as long as she remained here.

If she should be excepted would the Government pay her R. R. fare?

And how much time does the business course take. I would like to know all about it please.
