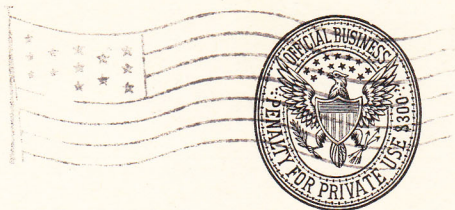

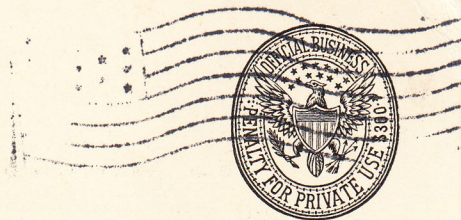

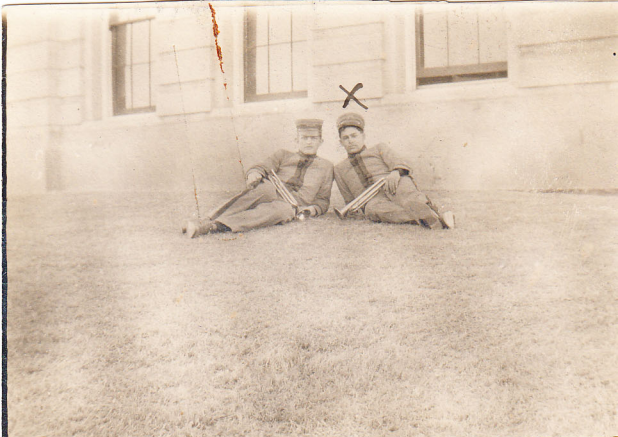

My dear Friend:

Replying to your favor of August the 20th, I will state that the amount of \$167.00 that has to be paid by students who are members of one of the Five Civilized Tribes will pay for tuition, board, clothing, laundry work and all other expenses for one whole school year. There will not be any other expense except for such articles of clothing the student may wish to procure for his own use, and which are not provided by the government.

As other students here are required to devote equal time to academic and industrial work, those who pay for their tuition will have to do likewise. In all other ways they will have to conform to the same regulations and rules that govern all other students.

I will state further that students should be at least fourteen years of age before they are sent to Car-

lisle, but when they pay tuition they may be more than twenty-one. They may be in any of the lower grades or without any school training at all. However, we will be able to do the best for them if they have been in schools before they come to Carlisle.

Herewith I enclose you blanks that may be handed to the young people at your home who can arrange to pay for their tuition at Carlisle, and any assistance you can give them will be appreciated. All applications should have noted thereon the approval of an official connected with the office of Superintendent Kelsey of the Union Agency at Muskogee.
