If I understand you right I think you wanted me to get some pupils for Carlisle. But I belong to The Creek Indians Civilize tribe. I understood once that Carlisle would not take

My dear Friend:

I have your favor of July the 20th and must advise that we cannot enroll students from the Five Civilized Tribes unless they can arrange to provide for their transportation and to pay an amount of \$167.00 each per year for tuition. Under those circumstances I will not ask you to give the names of students as was requested under recent date. However, if there are any who can meet the requirements mentioned above I will be pleased to have you refer them to me.

Allow me to explain that the communication that was addressed to you some time ago was one of many similar ones that was sent to our graduates and former students and that it

was not noted that you are a member of the
Five Civilized Tribes.

Assuring you that I was pleased to hear

I own a nice farm
house with orchard + field + meadow,
We own many other acres of field which is rented out,

6. What property in the way of land, stock, buildings, or money do you have?

We own about 460 acres of land all in
cultivation and buildings and some stock.

7. Have you been in the Indian Service? In what positions? How long in each?

I taught school in the years of 1896
to 1898. I used to be a clerk for District
Judge, in the time of Creek Tribal Government,

8. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle?

I was a matron at Nuyaka Mission in the dining room and cooking department. I cooked for twenty-pupils.

9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life:

My husband was a school teacher too. He taught school about twenty-five miles away from home and had to move to where he taught and we lived there in the settlement of full blood Creek Indians. He was successful with his school. And also there was a church house about all the church members were back-sliding excepting two old women. Mr. Goate preached for them till he brought back all the church members to attending church again. Miss Alice M. Robertson was the Supt. of schools at that time. Miss Robertson use to be a clerk at Carlisle school at the time I was there.

I have stated all of most interest connected with my life. Which I suppose would be interesting to you to learn something of an old Carlisle student. This recalls my memory back to Carlisle school many years ago. I left school early in June in 1884.
