I am one of the old returned students. I just received a copy of the Arrow and in looking over contents, I came across a list of my Class mates, Class of 1899. and I felt as though I was among the deceased list as I did not stay and graduate with the class. I returned home

March. Of course I
have attended other
schools since that time
and made up for what
I lost but I should have
appreciated Carlisle diploma.

I am keeping house
and attending to house-
hold duties at present
time. It has been long
time ago that I was
at Carlisle yet I feel
as though I know good
many of the students
that I have read about
and know by name
and their record in
the school work. I have
three children, one boy
and two girls. My son
is at Chillicothe. He is

my engineering,
and he is also a member
of the band; plays
Cornet. The girls go to
school here in town.
They both play the
piano. The larger girl
plays mandolin in
the High School orchestra.

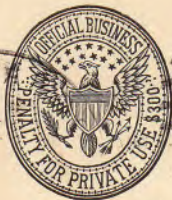
