fairs, and usually compete for
prizes with fair success.*

The Agent looks to my husband
to over-see ~~the~~ Indians of the Blackledge
District and depend a good deal upon
him.

12. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life

Note:

Mr & Mrs Bonpard are looked upon
as one of the most influential & progressive
couples on the Reservation. They are making
a good comfortable living, and are a fine example
of the older Indians who are making good.
If other Indians were as careful of their stock,
farm, & living, there would be much less
of an Indian Problem. Both talk English
but Mrs Bonpard writes very little. His good
qualities make up for any lack of white man's
arts.

To show this fact to the interested public in a convincing form, I purpose to issue, before long, a pamphlet giving photographs of the homes of some of our representative graduates and ex-students. I want your help in this attempt. I understand you own a good comfortable home. May I ask that you send me a photograph of your home to be used for the purpose above named. I will appreciate your aid, and will be glad to return the photograph after I have had a cut made from it. Please wrap the photograph well, with the proper backing so it will not be broken in the mail. I will be glad to reimburse you for whatever the photographs cost you.
