At the time when I was returned from the Carlisle School it was so hard to make the Indians believe in the way of education, And at that time I could'nt hardly use my own language. However I tried my best and finely I had the work started among the Kiowa Indians. I worked with two white ladies Miss R. J. Reeside and Miss L. Ballew and have worked faithfully toghahter for 3 years. And to-day I am proud to say that the Kiowa Indian s are living clean and living like white peoples.
