Replying to your favor of April the 27th, this is to state that the "Epworth Hymnals" are yet in general use at this school and that none of the copies here can be sold to you because they are the property of the Government.

I have learned that in the past a worn copy which yet contained most of the pages was sometimes given to a pupil going home, but only those unfit for further use here could be so given away.

As the school year will not close until the latter part of May the books to be discarded have not yet been selected, and just at present even a worn copy could not be sent you.
