I regret that I was careless in not answering your former letter. On receiving your second letter I was pleased to know that the "dear old school" has an interest in us yet. I do not like to be over proud when I write of myself, but I have tried to live up to what the school taught me. Mr Corbett built a nice brick house (the first one in this county) a large barn, and set out an orchard, which had fruit last year. We have all kinds of small fruit, which I can and preserve for the winter. I can not say that our life is better than other students, we are only trying to live as our white neighbors, helping in the Church work. I am proud though to say Paul is a good honest man, the Indian people have confidence in him. I would rather you asked some one to write what they think of us.
