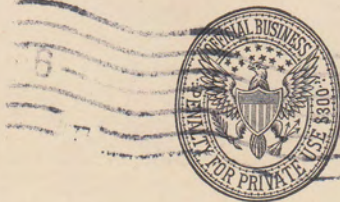
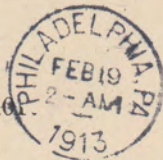
Mrs Denny:—
