We have tried to get our farm in as good condition as possible and have succeeded in getting about 20 acres ^{more} extra cleared since coming on this place and under cultivation, about 13 acres are just going thro the process of being improved. We hope to have quite a comfortable home in a few years.

We often think ^{of} ^{talk} our pleasant ^{profitable} saryourn at Carlisle and hope some day to go to see the dear old place again. We see our old school mates quite often, there are quite a number of them living around here, and the most of them are doing quite well.

Now, Mr. Friedman as I have given you quite a little insight of our home, even if we have not sounded a trumpet of our doings, you can see that we have not altogether failed in the Carlisle idea.

You are to call in and pay us a visit when ever you pass this way. we have the R. Route passing our door, and this week a cream wagon is to pass our farm gathering milk & cream for the Larson creamery, at the other end of the reserve, quite a few will sell their milk from around here.

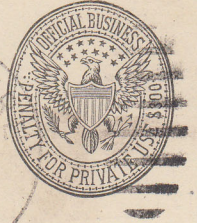
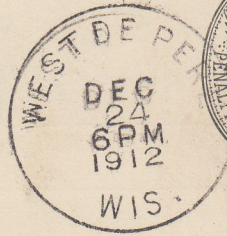
P. S. Again.
