I have never held any positions since leaving Carlisle.

9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life:

I do not know of anything interesting in my life or any thing so very different from others, except that it has been very hard. and my advice to all Carlisle pupils would be to "Stick to old Carlisle as long as you can."

Electa Schuyler, who left Carlisle in 1900 and who subsequently married H. D. Metoxen, writes that they expect to move into their new house in the spring. She is very much interested in her housekeeping and occasionally does interpreting for the Oneidas.
