for me - Oblige

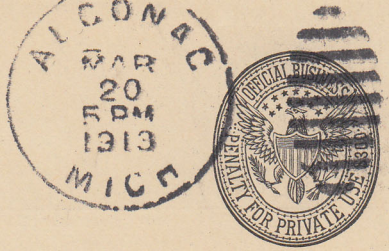
