1. Are you married and if so to whom? Yes. To Hugh L. Head
2. What is your present address? Ogden, Utah. C/o Forest Service
3. Did you attend or graduate from any other schools after leaving Carlisle? Yes Give names of schools and dates if possible Attended Haskell Institute for two years, graduating from there June , 1909.
4. What is your present occupation? Stenographer & Typewriter, Forest Service, Ogden, Utah.
5. Tell something of your present home We rented a modern 5-room cottage when we were first married, but owing to the work connected with so much room, we tried boarding for a time, but now have a parlor bedroom, and kitchenette,- Furniture all our own, light-housekeeping.
6. What property in the way of land, stock, buildings, or money do you have?
Besides my allotment, consisting of 120 acres, 40 of which my mother gave me, I have my monthly salary of \$75, a small investment in a St. Louis "building association", and about \$180.00 in the bank, the bank money, of course, being part of my husbands' savings.
7. Have you been in the Indian Service? In what positions? How long in each? No.

8. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle? I have been stenographer in two or three firms in Kansas City, only temporary, pending expected appointment in the Government Service. I would substitute for the stenographer, while she was away on vacation, either one or two months, earning at the most, only \$50 per month, when perhaps her salary had been as much as \$65. but I was only a beginner then.

9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life:

I accepted this position in November, 1909, and in February, 1910, I married Mr. Head, a Latter Day Saint, (Mormon in other words).

My position here paid so well, and was not at all difficult that I decided to remain, especially since Mr. Head, who is timekeeper for the Ogden Rapid Transit only earns \$60 a month. But on our combined earnings, \$135 a month, we live very well, saving occasionally, and dressing very well.

This summer we are both going back to Kansas City for a visit and a trip.

My brother Frank, I believe is in Webb City, Mo. But you could address him in care of our mother, whose address is --
