For and in consideration of the United States assuming the care, education, and maintenance in the United States School at Carlisle Indian School, Pa., of Blanche Shay, Female, I, Jennie Paul of Old Town P. O. State of Maine, do hereby voluntarily consent and agree to her enrollment in said school for a period of (3) years, and also obligate and bind myself to abide by all the rules and regulations for Indian Schools.

I further say that the child was born at Indian Island, on July 24, 1892 that the father, Joseph Shay was a 1/2 Indian of the Penobscot Tribe located at Indian Island Agency; that he died April 29, 1899; that the mother, Jennie Paul, is a 3/4 Indian of the Penobscot Tribe located at Old Town Indian Island Agency; that said child was born and reared in the United States, and now actually resides therein; and that she has attended the following schools:

Indian Island School.

Old Town School.
