I have noted the contents of your letter of May the 1st, but regret to inform you that it will not be possible to enroll your daughter at this school for the reason that she has not reached the required age. The Office at Washington has ruled that we shall not enroll students at Carlisle until after they have reached the age of fourteen years.

It seems that the girl would be eligible for enrolment in every other particular, and I hope it will be possible for you to keep her in some other school until the time she has reached the age of eligibility for enrolment here, at which time this matter should be referred again.
