According to the custom of my people, I was married very young to a man with whom a contract had been made when I was a child. My husband did not speak English but was well to do, as such things are rated here, and provided well for his family. We had eight children, four of whom died when babies. A year and a half ago my husband died of lingering lung trouble and as none of my children are large enough to do very much on the ranches I turned to pottery making to feed my little children. My one larger boy does his best with the land and now that the three small children are no longer babies I will send them to a boarding school next year where they can have better food and care. I know well that an education will help them for it has helped me in a very practical way.
