when I was back east, to work with.

own any land yet, but we will, the Gov. is loting out the
land now this very year. we have 3 houses but not much

7. Have you been in the Indian Service? In what positions? How long in each? I myself
never been in service, but my husband was a policeman
once for 3 months and he hauls water for the day

8. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle? I cannot tell any more this part for myself, because I went with my husband, to work on railroad after we were married, untill we settle down we are having a home

9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life: he is a black Smith,

Well Mr Friedman, you may try to find out, about me, I thought I was to be the only one kept up, Carlisle ways, but I am glad

I see others are, I never forget the dear old Carlisle I have a son, whom was there last year with you James R Luther, Carlisle is like a Christians life ^{to me} when I was there, they make us be, just what we ought to be, good and honest & earnest in every way, but when some of us get home, did not make use of it, but I try my best, to keep up, what I had learned and I made use of it and my husband did the same, he only was to Albuquerque School, we have just enough to get along, 3 horses 3 wagons and a black smith shop, and a little trading store, as big as a nail top of your finger, 13 cows this is the truth I can tell, I hope you are satisfied by this time I wish Govoment have enough to pay my fare to see Carlisle once more,
