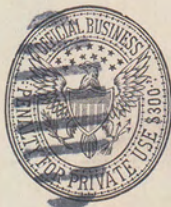

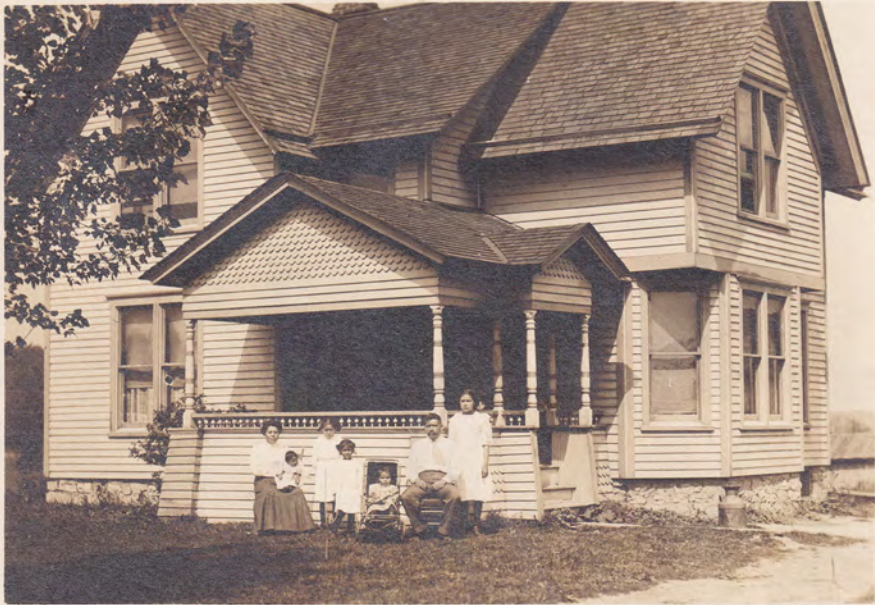
There are only a few old Carlisle students on our reservation. Most of the students, whose names you sent, live on other reservations. Shall I find out about them?
