

Henry failed to endorse the check to pay for this harness prior to his departure for Carlisle. Henry Ankle, who deserted from this school in
July 1913 after he had snatched a check from our financial clerk's desk and made away with it, drifted back
to Carlisle on September the 15th. It seemed necessary
to take him in again and it was decided to give him a
chance. Since then, however, it has been learned that
he is afflicted with venereal disease and so he must be
sent away at once. Henry does not have a cent of money,
but a ticket to Lemmon is being provided for his use,
and just as soon as it is learned what the cost of the
ticket will be I shall ask you to assist me in collecting the amount required to pay for the same. The charge
could not be considered a government charge and Henry
should be required to pay for it some time.

At Henry's request Mr. George Hanley has been notified that the former may be expected to arrive at home soon.

INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them are living, and if neither of them are living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, That hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats.,

p. 348.)

That no Indian pupil under the age of fourteen years shall be transported at Government expense to any Indian school beyond the limits of the State or Territory in which the parents of such child reside or of the adjoining State or Territory. (35 Stat. L., 781.)

The rules provide that-

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case; but in all cases where the parents are living they should first be consulted.

My dear Mr. Kneale; Referring further to my letter of October the 22nd I now take the liberty to state that Henry Ankle's transportation to Lemmon has been billed to me at a rate of \$35.36. An amount of \$2.00 was given Henry to pay for incidental expenses enroute, so I would thank you to co-operate with me in collecting an amount of \$37.36 to cover what had to be expended to get him away from Carlisle.
