While the Indian Office discourages the enrolment at Carlisle of pupils so far away from the school as you are, I am willing to consider the enrolment of your brother here if he is willing to pay his own transportation to Carlisle. Of course he will have to qualify in other respects too, that is he must not be over 21 years of age and not younger than fourteen and must have completed third grade work in school.

I enclose an application blank which your brother can fill out, if he can qualify, and return to me. He must have the endorsement of the Superintendent out there.

Trusting that it will be possible to give your brother the opportunities at Carlisle which you enjoyed, I am
