Dear Madam:-

I am in receipt of your letter of the 12th inst asking to enrol your son at this school. The regulations regarding the enrolment of Indian pupils in non-reservation schools are much more stringent than they used to be. We cannot enrol a pupil who has less than one-eighth degree of Indian blood, especially when he, at his home, has access to a good public school. Several years ago these facts made no difference in the enrolment of pupils in non-reservation schools.

Under the present regulations, I could not accept your son as a pupil here without special authority from the Indian Office.

In your letter you state that your son attended the Pipestone Indian School for a term of three years. If he has not completed the course there, I could not take him in this school because of another new regulation which requires that pupils remain in one non-reservation school until they have completed the course in that school.

If you can secure Leland's release from the Pipestone School and can get ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ from the Indian Office to enrol him here, I shall be glad to help you. (permission)

day. I am so anxious to have
in learn a trade and have
good influence around him as
there is making of a good man
in him if he has good associates
but in a Public school there are
so many bad boys and I am
a widow and trying to do the
best by him and its pretty
hard to watch his company
he keeps. He is very anxious
to go to an Indian school again
and as I attended Carlisle when
Col. Pratt was there I know what
a wonderful school Carlisle is.
Of course my boy only has $\frac{1}{4}$ ^{Indian} blood
but if he could get in there and
I could pay a small tuition
I might be able to, but of course
me being a widow and have
to make his living its pretty
hard sometime, but I am so
anxious to have him finish
at Carlisle as I loved the school

so and I know what a grand
place it is and what it does for
its pupils. I am a cousin of Mrs
Nellie Denny and she knows how
anxious I am to get Ireland my boy
in to Carlisle. Now I wish you
would give this your carefull con-
sideration as I am very anxious
about it. With kindest wishes
