My dear Mr. Spear:

Referring further to the inquiry contained in my letter of January the 31st and your reply thereto on February the 6th, this is to state that Madelon De-Cora was enrolled at this school on August the 26th of 1906. She went to her home on July the 4th of 1907 and did not return. Our records show that she was a 3/4 Winnebago.

The Samuel Thomas I had referred to was also known as Samuel Thompson. He was enrolled here from September the 19th of 1910 to June the 16th of last year. On the latter date he was sent to his home at Decatur, Nebraska.

Hoping that this additional information will be of assistance in locating the young people, I remain,
