Relatives of Moses Torrance, the Iroquois Indian, who died at the Homeopathic hospital Friday as a result of injuries sustained by falling from the rear of a New York Central passenger train, near Castleton, were yesterday located at Logansburg, Franklin county, by Coroner John E. Mullen, who notified them of the Indian's death. The body will later be sent to Logansburg by Undertaker A. B. Kiernan. It is said that Torrance is a direct descendant of an Iroquois chief.

My dear Sir:

Since the time your letter of February the 4th was delivered to me, in which you again mention the desire of Moses Terrance that he be enrolled at Carlisle, it has been learned that he advanced but one grade in his studies during all the time he was enrolled here.

It appears in our records that he was in the second grade when he left here and as he has not been in school since then he cannot be admitted because it is now required that students shall have completed not less than third grade work before they can be received here. Next year that requirement will probably have to be raised.

Regretting that I cannot co-operate with you as is desired, I remain,

Upon receipt of your card of the 12th instant, in which you called attention to Moses Terrance's claim that he was enrolled in the 4th grade when he left Carlisle, a further search was made thru our records. There is no other information, however, than that he was studying in the 3rd grade and only in that grade under conditions. I submit below for your information a copy of a report that was sent to me today by our Principal Teacher:

"The records of this Department do actually say that Moses Terrance completed Grade II in March, 1909, and was conditionally promoted into Grade III.

If the young man has been attending school since that time, it might be that he has qualified for something higher than Grade III, by this time. I should be willing to accept a statement from any reliable school official relative to his work, if any, in school since he left here."

In view of such information I must state again that Moses cannot be re-admitted at Carlisle.
