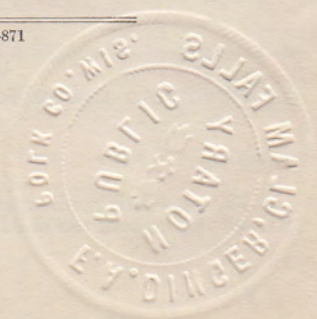

Chase of Clam Falls P. O., State of Wis. do hereby voluntarily consent and agree to her enrollment in said school for a period of three years, and also obligate and bind myself to abide by all the rules and regulations for Indian schools.

I further say that the said child was born at Clam Lake Wis. on Jan 20-1891 that the father, Hartley F. Chase is a White man Indian of the Tribe located at Agency; that he left the tribe about ; that the mother, Cila-wa-sing-pwe a Indian of the Chippewa Tribe located at Court Prairie Wis. Agency, and left the tribe about Aug 1-1880; that the said child was born and reared in the United States, and now actually resides therein; and that he has attended the following schools:

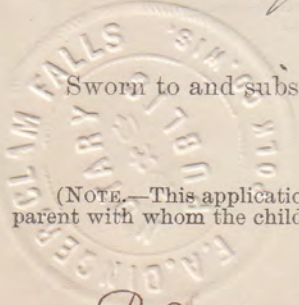

INDORSEMENT.

A child showing one-sixteenth or less Indian blood, whose parents live on an Indian reservation, Indian fashion, who, if debarred from the Government schools, could not obtain an education, may be permitted in the reservation day and boarding schools, but it is preferable that it be not transferred to a nonreservation school, without special permission from the Office. Children showing one-eighth or less Indian blood, whose parents do not live on an Indian reservation, whose home is among white people where there are churches and schools, who are presumed to have adopted the white man's manners and customs, and are to all intents and purposes white people, are debarred from enrollment in the Government nonreservation and reservation schools. Superintendents, in all cases where doubt exists as to the degree of Indian blood of a child proposed for transfer, should fully satisfy themselves of the facts by affidavits from reliable persons, which affidavits must be kept on file at the school.

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

A pupil dismissed from school for cause must not be enrolled in any other school without the permission of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs. Full facts must be submitted with each request.

Dear Friend:

I have your letter of September sixteenth, notifying me of the sad death of your husband, and requesting my assistance in getting a place in the Service. I would suggest that you write to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, Washington, D. C., telling him of the circumstances and place the whole matter before him. He will then give the matter consideration and advise you accordingly. As the usual thing, requests by persons of Indian blood for places in the Service are made by sending a blank to be filled out giving full information, and if the person is a returned student of Carlisle, a statement is usually requested from me as to their record. If this is done, I shall be very glad to recommend you favorably for a position, and hope that you will be successful in obtaining one.

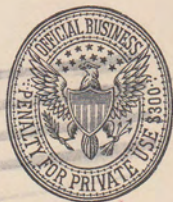
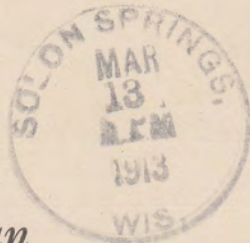
