

INDIANS TO COMPETE IN MARATHON CONTEST

SKY EAGLE, INDIAN RUNNER

Who Will Compete with White Sprinters in Los Angeles-Venice Marathon.

Judson Cabay, Swiftest of Chippewa Braves, and Sky Eagle to Be Running Mates in Race to Venice

Swiftest brave in all the Chippewa Indian tribe, Judson Cabay, Carlisle graduate and a long distance runner of no mean ability, is to compete in the Los Angeles-Venice marathon, to be held under the auspices of the Los Angeles Athletic club New Year's day or Washington's birthday. Which of these two dates will be selected has not been decided. Entered as running mate to Cabay will be Sky Eagle, another fullblood Chippewa.

Cabay and Sky Eagle were members of the "101" wild west show which closed its season here recently, and are now at Venice, where others of the camp of twenty-five Indians

traveling with the show also have their tents pitched. Cabay said yesterday that even more red men entrants might be secured for the local marathon before the date of the contest.

Cabay holds a Carlisle record for the ten-mile race of 54 minutes. He also covered fifteen miles in 1 hour and 26 minutes and ran the full marathon distance of twenty-six and a fraction miles in 2:31:19. Sky Eagle, also a fast sprinter, is proud of the Chippewa tribe's reputation for turning out great marathon runners and expects to uphold the honor of the tribe in this direction in the Los Angeles-Venice race.

WELL KNOWN INDIAN
MINISTER IS NOW DEAD

REV. JAMES CLOUD, MANY YEARS
A PREACHER, SUCCUMBS
AT AGE OF 80.

Rev. James Cloud, for many years a minister among the Indians, and himself a full blooded Indian, died Sunday night in "Indiantown," Kawkawlin township. He was 80 years old and had been ill, more or less, for about 2 years. He had for 60 years lived in the Kawkawlin Indian settlement and spent practically his entire life in missionary and other religious work among the Indians.

Rev. Mr. Cloud was born where the village of Midland now is situated, and was educated in Berea College, Berea, Ohio. Later in life he took up theological studies in Albion college. He was ordained a minister in 1864 and traveled thousands of miles on foot and on horseback among his fellow red men.

The deceased was one of the factors in bringing the Indians of Northeastern Michigan to their higher plane. He worked incessantly for their improvement—mentally, morally and physically. Only a few years ago he was instrumental in having a number of irregular marriages of Indians solemnized in the legal manner, he going to Prosecutor Hitchcock and securing his assistance. The Indians had been married according to the primitive rites of the tribes of years ago and such marriages are not recognized now. As a result, a dozen or more belated marriages were held.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday afternoon from his home in Indiantown. He is survived by a widow and three children—D. M. Cloud, Mrs. Peter Cabay and Mrs. James W. Johnstone, all living in Kawkawlin township.

INDORSEMENT.

A child showing one-sixteenth or less Indian blood, whose parents live on an Indian reservation, Indian fashion, who, if debarred from the Government schools, could not obtain an education, may be permitted in the reservation day and boarding schools, but it is preferable that it be not transferred to a nonreservation school, without special permission from the Office. Children showing one-eighth or less Indian blood, whose parents do not live on an Indian reservation, whose home is among white people where there are churches and schools, who are presumed to have adopted the white man's manners and customs, and are to all intents and purposes white people, are debarred from enrollment in the Government nonreservation and reservation schools. Superintendents, in all cases where doubt exists as to the degree of Indian blood of a child proposed for transfer, should fully satisfy themselves of the facts by affidavits from reliable persons, which affidavits must be kept on file at the school.

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

A pupil dismissed from school for cause must not be enrolled in any other school without the permission of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs. Full facts must be submitted with each request.
