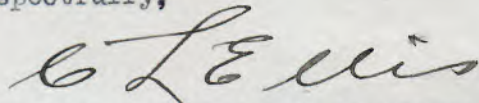

After being torpedoed about six fifty-five P.M. our rescue was made possible thru the brave efforts of the British sailors aboard the destroyers, who risked their own lives, in order to pull up alongside of the doomed Tuscania, But am pleased to inform you that, out side of a few accidents, the Officers and men behaved very manly; We all landed at different ports, in Ireland, where we remained for several days, before crossing the Irish Sea to England; This Aviation School being the second we have been at in England, and now long we will be here, I cannot say.
