Application for Enrollment in a Nonreservation School.

(For a child not enrolled at an Agency.)

For and in consideration of the United States assuming the care, education, and maintenance in the United States Indian School at Carlisle Pa, of Frank J. McCann, Male, I, Delena McCann (Name of child.) (Sex) (Parent, guardian, or next of kin.) of Springbrook, Wis P. O., State of Wis, do hereby voluntarily consent and agree to his enrollment in said school for a period of five years, and also obligate and bind myself to abide by all the rules and regulations for Indian schools. (Not less than 3.)

I further say that the said child was born at Springbrook on Aug. 26, 1889 (Date) that the father, James A. McCann, was a 1/4 Indian of the Chippewa (Name of father.) (Is or was.) (Degree.) Tribe located at Lapoint Agency; that he left the tribe about 1889 (Approximate date); that the mother, Delena McCann, is a 1/2 Indian of the Chippewa (Name.) (Is or was.) (Degree.) Tribe located at Lapoint Agency, and left the tribe about 1890 (Approximate date); that the said child was born and reared in the United States, and now actually resides therein; and that he has attended the following schools:

INDORSEMENT.

A child showing one-sixteenth or less Indian blood, whose parents live on an Indian reservation, Indian fashion, who, if debarred from the Government schools, could not obtain an education, may be permitted in the reservation day and boarding schools, but it is preferable that it be not transferred to a nonreservation school, without permission from the Office. Children showing one-eighth or less Indian blood, whose parents do not live on an Indian reservation, whose home is among white people where there are churches and schools, who are presumed to have adopted the white man's manners and customs, and are to all intents and purposes white people, are debarred from enrollment in the Government nonreservation and reservation schools. Superintendents, in all cases where doubt exists as to the degree of Indian blood of a child proposed for transfer, should fully satisfy themselves of the facts by affidavits from reliable persons, which affidavits must be kept on file at the school.

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other non-reservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

A pupil dismissed from school for cause must not be enrolled in any other school without the permission of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs. Full facts must be submitted with each request.

The wages were smaller than what I am getting - My present place of employment is about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Clippewa Falls. (a City of about 10,000) The institution is the state Home for feeble minded - we have about 1200 patients and employ about 600 attendants & other hands. It is a beautiful place and everything is done to make it pleasant for the patients as well as the employees -

Mr. Friedman I am sorry
I had to leave your
school as I did, it would
have been impossible
for me to stay for
several reasons, I was
not learning anything
in the industry line
the disciplinarian kept
me working in the
clothing room at the
large boys quarters I
asked him several
times for a change.
but never accomplished
anything, I asked
to work in the studio
and I ~~was~~ asked to

learn telegraphy as
some of the other boys
were learning ~~at~~ it in
town as to my schooling
I was doing the ~~work~~ work
in room 9 when I should
have been in room 12
for I often helped my
room-mate with his
work who was in room
12.

Mr. Friedman I asked
you and Mr. Myers in
a kind way if my brother
and I could spend our
vacation at home instead
of going out in the
country to work I

told Mr. Myers we would
 pay our transportation
 both ways as we could
 make more money out
 here than we could
 out there all summer
 the wages here are never
~~less~~ less than ~~\$~~ 30 and
 expenses I got ~~\$~~ 3.00 a
 day all ~~that~~ that
 summer working in
 a canning factory (in 1909)
 at the present time
 I am working in the
 institution, The Wisconsin
 Home for feeble minded,
 my wages are ~~\$~~ 5.00 a
 month and maintenance

I also get ~~\$~~ 10 a week
playing violin in an
orchestra in Chippewa Falls
my brother and sister
are also working here.
I met some boys from
Carlisle Indian school
last week who are
traveling with a Carnival
Co. from Michigan, two
boys that I knew played
in the Indian band
with the Carnival. The
names were, (Carl Sylvester
and Howard Pierce.)
Nick Bailey was the boss
of the Indian show.

There were several other
 Indians from Carlisle
 that I didn't know, Nick
 Baily was a graduate
 from there.

I thank you very
 much for the magazine
 as I found a good
 deal of interest in it

I must now close
 hoping to hear from
 you again.
