You would also have to pay for your transportation to Carlisle.

The Regulations require that children must be fourteen years of age before they can be admitted here unless an older brother or sister is enrolled at the same time and then only when the parents pay for the transportation of such younger child.

It has been noted that you desire to take work in our mason's department if you are given permission to return to school, but as instruction has to be given in all lines of masonry and plastering in that department you must realize that you could probably not be allowed to devote all your time to the study and practice of bricklaying.
