The only available vacancy at the present time for which you could be considered is a minor one -- that of assistant matron at \$300 a year at the Kickapoo School, Kansas.

Indians filling positions paying \$300 a year or less are allowed to board with the pupils free of charge.

There is no position at the Kickapoo School at the present time for which your husband could be considered but it is suggested that you correspond with Superintendent Edwin Minor, concerning the duties of the position referred to above and if you are willing to accept the same inform the Office at once.
