My dear Friend;—

I thought I would drop you a few lines to let you know how I am getting along. I often think of dear Carlisle and I realize that school days at Carlisle were the happiest days of my life.

It is now four years since I have been married. I have two very dear children a girl age three years and my boy a year old. Thier names are Violet Mae and Charles. They both won first prize at the Keshena Fair. Violet was dressed in Indian costume and Charles was the cleanest baby on the grounds.

Somehow or other bad luck has been in our way for a year now. We had a very happy home, my husband was working every day

for us until he got sick. The doctor
told me it was lung trouble he had.
Now he is in Canada in hopes of
recovering. As for myself I am here
at the Hospital on the reservation and
I earn twentyfive (⁸25) a month. I
know that you like to hear from all
exstudents so I thought I would
write to you closing with my best
wishes for Carlisle, Hoping to hear
from you soon.
