My dear Sir:

I regret to advise you that your son John has proven himself entirely unworthy of being continued as a student at this school, so it is desired that you send without delay the amount of money that will be required to pay for his transportation home. John should have a small amount for incidental expenses, so that about \$40.00 will be required.

If he has funds of his own to his credit the amount that was expended in bringing him to Carlisle should also be sent to me to reimburse the government. The cost of his ticket from Skiatook to Carlisle was \$51.67.

Hoping that you will let me hear from you without delay, so that your son can be gotten away from Carlisle, I am,

My dear Sir:

Referring further to my letter of January the 2nd, this is to advise that there is available at the Carlisle Deposit Bank here in Carlisle an amount of \$40.00 which is to be used to provide transportation for the use of your son John. It is presumed that you made that amount available and that it is your desire that he be sent to your home as I recommended. Accordingly arrangements have been made to send him away tomorrow evening. Transportation for his passage to Skiatook will be procured for his use and a small amount will be allowed him with which to pay for his incidental expenses enroute home.

In this connection I must again call attention to the amount of \$31.87 which was expended to bring your son to Carlisle and which amount should be sent to me to reimburse the government. I would thank you to let me hear from you in regard to the matter.


