Mr. Strohm seems to get along well with William and is willing to pay him \$4. per month for the season of 1912. He, William, is now doing chores for his board and does not attend school. This arrangement was thought best for William since he is above school age and because of his bad conduct when at school. Better remuneration will be secured for him when he shows his worthiness. William has strength and ability to earn at least \$8 per month in the summer season, or \$5 the whole year through. All that is in question is his willingness. I am in favor of his remaining where he is during the coming season but his wages should begin in March and be increased to at least \$4. per month.
