### INDORSEMENT.

A child showing one-sixteenth or less Indian blood, whose parents live on an Indian reservation, Indian fashion, who, if debarred from the Government schools, could not obtain an education, may be permitted in the reservation day and boarding schools, but it is preferable that it be not transferred to a nonreservation school, without permission from the Office. Children showing one-eighth or less Indian blood, whose parents do not live on an Indian reservation, whose home is among white people where there are churches and schools, who are presumed to have adopted the white man's manners and customs, and are to all intents and purposes white people, are debarred from enrollment in the Government nonreservation and reservation schools. Superintendents, in all cases where doubt exists as to the degree of Indian blood of a child proposed for transfer, should fully satisfy themselves of the facts by affidavits from reliable persons, which affidavits must be kept on file at the school.

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other non-reservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

A pupil dismissed from school for cause must not be enrolled in any other school without the permission of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs. Full facts must be submitted with each request.

## INDIAN BRAVE TRIES TO ENLIST IN AERO CORPS

Iroquois Who Attended  
Carlisle School Applies  
at Local Station

### WAS MUNITION WORKER

David Bureau, Iroquois Indian, was among the applicants for enlistment at the local aviation station yesterday. Bureau is aged 21, and was born on the Indian reservation near Hoggansburg, N Y. He attended the Government Indian School at Carlisle for seven years, studying mechanical engineering, and when aged 15 left that institution and has since been work-

ing at munition and automobile factories. He is a good mechanic and has been employed at good wages, but he wants to learn to be a flyer.

Bureau's left hand is slightly crippled, the ends of the thumb and index finger of his left hand having been injured by the explosion of a dynamite cap with which he was playing when a boy. Captain Hamilton took his application and will make especial effort to enlist him if he passes the physical and mental tests.

Bureau became of age in August, but registered for military service under the draft last June in Syracuse, N. Y. Captain Hamilton, when acquainted with the fact, said that it would not interfere with his enlistment, as he was without the draft age at the time of registration.

Lieut Com Newton Mansfield, in charge of local naval recruiting, yesterday received instructions from the Bureau of Navigation to the effect that Naval Coast Defense Reserves, who have volunteered for general naval service and who are located outside the naval district, may be promoted to ensigns the same as regular naval seamen. Heretofore Naval Coast Defense Reserves stationed outside the naval district were not eligible to such promotion.

Recruiting at the local military stations was quiet yesterday. Only 10 applicants were accepted at the army station, two at the navy station and none at either the British-Canadian station or the marine station.
