Dear Friend:

It is the request of Superintendent Lipps that a copy of our school catalogue be mailed to you and that you be provided with a number of blank forms upon which applications for enrolment at Carlisle may be brought to Superintendent Buntin's attention. The catalogue and the blanks are being mailed to you under a separate cover.

As it is your desire to return to Carlisle to take additional work, but you are now over 21 years of age and your transportation cannot be provided at Government expense, it is suggested that you ask Superintendent Buntin to escort a party of students to Carlisle. If six young people can be selected to come with you your transportation as escort to the party can be provided.

Regarding your return to school I can only state that I would be glad to co-operate with you to make the desired arrangements, but the business you are planning to learn cannot be taught you here. There are a number of so-called schools which claim to teach the automobile repair business, but the owners of cars who want repairing done patronize only those repairmen who have had the practical experience which can only be gained by continued work on different kinds of machines. It is doubtful whether a school could give you the training you are anxious to secure.

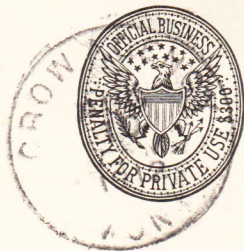
