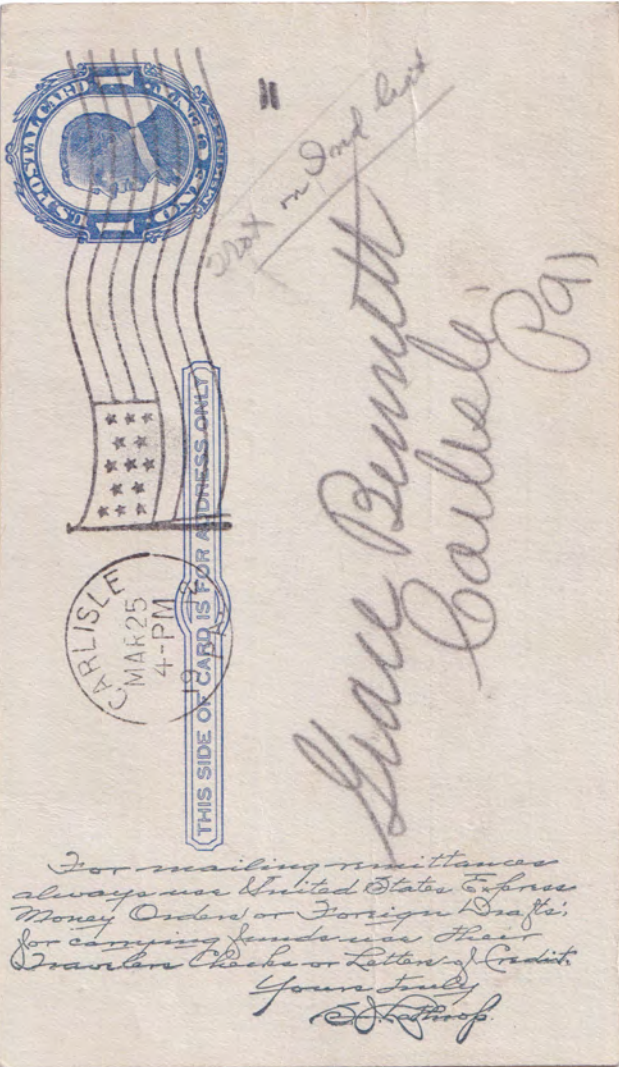

9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life: I am motherless and my grandmother died a year ago June 1st if you remember is the reason I left Carlisle, so I have no woman relative. I want to come back to Carlisle and finish there. I am a "Freshman."
