There is enclosed herewith check for \$168.46 transferring the account of Anna Pierce under section 16 individual Indian monies. The records of this girl show that she received \$250.00 from a patron of the outing for taking unlawful relations with her while at his home. She has been permitted to draw upon this amount for the purpose of going home and for doctor bills since at home at Onoville N.Y. The remainder is the balance herewith enclosed. She now writes for money from Salamanca where she says she is at present working. It occurred to me that since she has employment she ought to be self supporting instead of being a tax upon her resources. Her case is therefore referred to you to do what is best for the girl.
