hope you people will be
glad to hear that we are
working hard on our farm
we are showing what we
learn at Carlisle. I thank
you Carlisle make me
learn how to farm &

take care of every thing in
 farm. I hope one of your
 people come over to Thurston
 and how we working.
 our corns down here are 4
 feet tall now. and the
 oats turn to brown ready
 for cutting down. Well
 I have nothing else to
 say so I say good bye.




