SPECIAL NOTE.

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a nonreservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the Agency records. The agent will then send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

If the information called for on any part of the blank is not known, that fact should be stated. No space should be left unfilled. Whether the parents are living or dead, their names must be given.

The person who signs the blank as consenting to the transfer should indicate his relation to the applicant by marking out the word "parent," "guardian," or "next of kin," leaving unmarked only the title appropriate to the signer.

INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them are living, and if neither of them are living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, That hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

The rules provide that—

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case; but in all cases where the parents are living they should first be consulted.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations or Indian schools to nonreservation schools.

However, the matter has been referred to the Superintendent in charge of the Turtle Mountain Indians, Belcourt, North Dakota, and upon receipt of his report you will be advised further.

Sir:

Referring to your inquiry of March 2, 1914, (Glasgow No. 013660 "G" M.McC.) you are advised that Joseph Bonzie, minor child of Bonnar Bonzie (Bernard Bergie) of Warwick, N. Dak., has failed to establish a right to allotment on the public domain under the provisions of the fourth Section of the Act of February 8, 1887 (24 Stat. L., 388), as amended.

Investigation discloses that Clarina Bergie, the mother of this applicant, is a member of the Devils Lake Sioux tribe of Indians; and his father an unaffiliated mixed blood without tribal recognition. The mother is a member only by adoption and at the time she was adopted her children were excluded from membership. The evidence in support of the claims of Joseph Bonzie is not of such character as would enable the Office to certify that he is entitled to allotment under existing laws.

It is recommended, therefore, that his fourth section allotment application No. 013660 be cancelled and the case closed.

The Office has received your letter of December 28 requesting information in behalf of Joseph Bergie, now living at 910 $\frac{1}{2}$ Green Avenue, Altoona, Pa., as to the status of his allotment.

Only duly enrolled members of the Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewas can procure allotment on the public domain by reason of membership with said band, and on May 2, 1913, this Office advised Joseph Bergie through the Superintendent of the Carlisle School that he was not enrolled as a member of the Turtle Mountain Chippewas.

Further investigation showed this applicant to be without tribal affiliation and therefore not entitled to allotment. The General Land Office was advised to this effect by Office letter dated October 6, 1914, a copy of which is enclosed for your further information.
