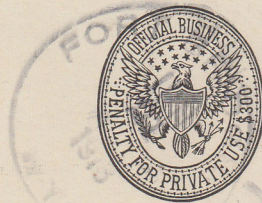

Your interesting letter of the 24 was received, and the money reached me safe.

And now I must thank you for your kindness, and favors you have done for me.

Though according to my figures I have some more money to my credit than in the bank. And wish you would look into the matter for me.

I am sure there is some mistake in the bankers books, or else I would of received the full amount.

I will explain to how I know. A few days before I left the school I went to Mr. Miller and ask him how much I had to my credit, and he told me I had \$63.00 and some few since. And Mr. Carley had only sent five payments up to me so that left me \$33.00 to come from town yet.

And then I drew \$40.00 when I left the school. In the first place I had \$38.00 in the bank, and earned \$8.00 in town, while



working there. I have \$96.00, and have only  
received \$71.37, and would like to have you  
see a font the rest, that is to come to me.

There should be \$24.63 more. After working  
for it, I don't feel as though I can afford to  
lose it, and wish you would see into the  
matter.
