I am in receipt of your letter of June 17, advising that Isaac Brazeau would be required to pay his transportation from this place to your school amounting to \$31.88.

It is noted that Isaac deserted your school on the 1st inst., and that you have heard nothing from him since. He has money to his credit at this Agency, and we shall arrange for him to remit the \$31.88 to you, but it will be impossible to do so until his return to the reservation. The matter will be kept in mind and a settlement made with you immediately upon his return.
