My Dear Mr Lipps:-

I regret to inform you that Albert Fremont passed away this morning. The disease assumed the type of acute tubercular pneumonia, or galloping consumption, spreading rapidly through both lungs, quickly exhausting him.

Joel Dagg is improving. Affairs at the Sanatorium are progressing nicely and Spring work is about completed. Besides our other crops we have planted about thirty acres of corn and seeded sixty acres to mixed grass for the cows.

Doctor Murphy is expected soon to attend the Medical Association which meets here the last of the month. Doctor Pinkerton recently inspected the dairy, milk supplies, etc., and was very much in favor of the plans for the new dairy barn.

Mrs Lipps, in a conversation over the telephone this evening, said that your family are all well;


My dear Mr. Lipps:



My dear Dr. Alley:

We have a young man here named Joseph Dog, from one of the Dakota reservations, who has incipient tuberculosis. He appears to be a fine young man, or boy rather as he is only about eighteen years of age, and the physician here has diagnosed his case as incipient tuberculosis, but before any definite steps are taken, he wishes to give him the tuberculin test. The boy has been working and going to school right along, and appears to be a very desirable pupil for your Institution. He is very anxious to be sent to Fort Lapwai. He says he had a cousin who went there a year or so ago and was returned to his home practically cured. If the physician here decided that he should be sent, I should be very glad if you can accept him. No doubt I could arrange to pay part of his transportation, or at least send him home and allow you to place transportation there for him for the rest of the journey. Please wire me on receipt of this, if you have room for him.

I was in Washington last week and had the oppor-

tunity of telling the Commissioner and the Supervisors of the good work you are doing at Fort Lapwai. The Commissioner appeared to be very much interested, and I feel that I paved the way for presenting for favorable consideration the several matters contained in your letter of recent date relative to your needs. Fort Lapwai is certainly on the map, and I hear it spoken of quite frequently.

I am in temporary charge here, and have no idea how long I shall have to remain. I shall return to the Northwest just as soon as I am relieved here, which I hope will not be a very great while.
