We have a young man here named Joseph Dog, from one of the Dakota reservations, who has insipient tuberculosis. He appears to be a fine young man, or boy rather as he is only about eighteen years of age, and the physician here has diagnosed his case as incipient tuberculosis, but before any definite steps are taken, he wishes to give him the tuberculin test. The boy has been working and going to school right along, and appears to be a very desirable pupil for your Institution. He is very anxious to be sent to Fort Lapwai. He says he had a cousin who went there a year or so ago and was returned to his home practically cured. If the physician here decided that he should be sent, I should be very glad if you can accept him. No doubt I could arrange to pay part of his transportation, or at least send him home and allow you to place transportation there for him for the rest of the journey.
