SPECIAL NOTE.

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a nonreservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school shall be furnished with the original of this form for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the office of the superintendent in charge of the reservation. The Reservation Superintendent will then send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

If the information called for on any part of the blank is not known, that fact should be stated. No space should be left unfilled. Whether the parents are living or dead, their names must be given.

The person who signs the blank as consenting to the transfer should indicate his relation to the applicant by marking out the word "parent," "guardian," or "next of kin," leaving unmarked only the title appropriate to the signer. 6-870

INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them are living, and if neither of them are living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, That hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

That no Indian pupil under the age of fourteen years shall be transported at Government expense to any Indian school beyond the limits of the State or Territory in which the parents of such child reside or of the adjoining State or Territory. (35 Stat. L., 781.)

The rules provide that—

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case; but in all cases where the parents are living they should first be consulted.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations or Indian schools to nonreservation schools.

My dear Sir:

Upon receipt of your letter of June the 15th, in which you conveyed to me your own and the wishes of Edward Jones's brother regarding the latter's return home for the summer months, I learned that Edward has just been discharged from our Hospital where he was confined with a stubborn case of venereal trouble. He now seems discouraged, is anxious to return home, and in fact has not done very much of anything for himself or anyone else.

Under the circumstances I recommend that the necessary funds be sent for his transportation so that he can be returned home. If Edward has not learned by this time how to be manly and how to take care of himself it is my opinion that his remaining at Carlisle would not be of very much more benefit to him unless he would decide to make better use of his time than he has made of it.

Dear Sir:

Referring to your letter of June 11, relative to the return of Edward Jones, of your school, to the reservation for the summer period, I have to state that unless his term has expired, or it is deemed inexpedient in the interests of Carlisle to return him for the continuation of his term, I would suggest that he be not allowed to return for any portion of the vacation period to the reservation. In explanation of such suggestion, I would state that he has no home to return to, and it has been proven by past experiences that his natural proclivities have no other tendencies than to have a demoralizing effect upon him while in the reservation environment. His brother is his nearest relative on the reservation, and he is not desirous of having him return, and was mainly instrumental in inducing Edward in going to Carlisle when he went to that institution.

If you still think that it will be beneficial to Edward to return for the summer, and will advise me to that effect, I will see that funds sufficient for his traveling
