My dear Sir:

I have noted the contents of your letter of June the 11th and of the copy of a letter you transmitted therewith for my information. Replying thereto I have to state that since no real necessity is shown for the return home of Charlotte Gadotte and her sister and because you have not recommended that such action shall be taken I will not give my consent to have them leave for the summer months.

It has usually been my policy to give students permission to go home only when a necessity for such action is shown and when a request for such leave has been approved by the Superintendent in charge of the student when at home.

As Bayfield does not seem to be a safe place for the girls I shall co-operate with you in keeping them here until you advise to the contrary.


Dear Sir:

Enclosed I am sending you a copy of a letter which I have this day forwarded to Charlotte Cadotte, known to us as Charlotte Bemesay.

I have several times advised the mother and father that I wished to leave the matter of vacation for the children entirely in your hands as you are in a better position to decide whether they should have a vacation or not. I advised them that I thought it was the usual plan to grant a vacation the second year if the amount of the return fare was deposited with the Superintendent before they left for home. I would like to have the young ladies continue their school work, and I do not think that Bayfield is a particularly safe place for these young people in the summer time.

I have this day made an application for \$75.00 for each of the two girls and will forward the checks for deposit with you on return of the approved applications.

Dear Charlotte:

Referring to your letter of June 8th. I recently sent you and your sister in care of the Supervisor in Charge, \$50.00 each. It appears if the Supervisor in Charge wishes you to come home, there would have been enough money left of this amount to pay your fare, in view of the fact that you were well equipped with clothes before you went to Carlisle. I have no objections to your coming home for a vacation if your Superintendent permits, but as I told your mother, when you are transferred to a school the first decision in all matters relating to your attendance, etc., lies with the Superintendent in whose immediate charge you are, and I feel sure that if he wishes to have you come home for a vacation and you had requested him to write for funds, that he would have been glad to do so. I do not wish to burden the Superintendent with requests which I know he can well take care of himself, and I would, therefore, suggest that you go to him and take up the matter of your vacation, and if he wishes to let you come home, have him write for funds to pay for your fare.

I am sending a copy of this letter to the Superintendent


so that he will understand the matter when it is presented to

I am making applications for yourself and your sister
for \$75.00 each, and as soon as the applications are returned, and
I receive word from the Superintendent that he wishes you to have
a vacation, I will forward a check for \$75.00 for each of you to
the Superintendent.

I am very glad to hear that you like Carlisle and
that you wish to continue your school work. I felt that this
would be so if once started at either Carlisle or one of the other
large non-reservation schools, and I hope that you will work hard
and get as much benefit from your school work as possible.

Since writing my letter I have had a conversation with the mother and I believe that she will look after the girls this summer and return them to Carlisle in good shape. The girls live on an Island just opposite Bayfield, and if not permitted to run to Bayfield whenever they choose, I believe that they will profit by their vacation.

Enclosed please find two checks for \$75.00 each for Charlotte and her sister Julia. This will cover the cost of the round trip passage and allow something for the meals enroute. The cost of the return passage is, of course, to be retained by you. Kindly return the receipts to this office.

My dear Sir:

Among the girls now at their homes "on leave", and about the advisability of whose return to Carlisle this fall there is some question, are Julia and Charlotte Cadotte. They are not bad girls by any means, but their record here during the past year was not satisfactory, and if they cannot be made to see the importance of returning to school with but the one idea of making the best possible use of their time I should prefer not to have them resume their studies here.

Will you please take the matter into consideration with the girls and their parents, and then advise me what their attitude is? If they do return to Carlisle and will not do better than they did last year I would recommend later in the year that arrangements be made to have them taken home.


