INDORSEMENT.

A child showing one-sixteenth or less Indian blood, whose parents live on an Indian reservation, Indian fashion, who, if debarred from the Government schools, could not obtain an education, may be permitted in the reservation day and boarding schools, but it is preferable that it be not transferred to a nonreservation school, without special permission from the Office. Children showing one-eighth or less Indian blood, whose parents do not live on an Indian reservation, whose home is among white people where there are churches and schools, who are presumed to have adopted the white man's manners and customs, and are to all intents and purposes white people, are debarred from enrollment in the Government nonreservation and reservation schools. Superintendents, in all cases where doubt exists as to the degree of Indian blood of a child proposed for transfer, should fully satisfy themselves of the facts by affidavits from reliable persons, which affidavits must be kept on file at the school.

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

A pupil dismissed from school for cause must not be enrolled in any other school without the permission of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs. Full facts must be submitted with each request.



SPECIAL NOTE.

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a non-reservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the Agency records. The agent will then send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

NOTE.—Age limits, fourteen to twenty years. Preferably fourteen to eighteen. Students must be at least one-fourth Indian, preferably full Indian. Special cases beyond the age limit will be given consideration. An industrial course only can be taken and the term reduced to three years, in exceptional cases.

INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them is living, and if neither of them is living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, that hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

The rules provide that—

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations, or Indian schools, to nonreservation schools.

My dear Sir:

Referring to your letter of March the 1st, I have to advise that your son Barney's period of enrolment does not terminate at the close of this school year, so if you need him at home during the vacation months your request for his services should be submitted to me thru the office of your Superintendent.

I will also call attention to the fact that when students are called home before the termination of their period of enrolment an amount sufficient to cover transportation home and back again to Carlisle will have to be placed on deposit here. Then when the period of leave is over a ticket for the return to school will be made available from this end.

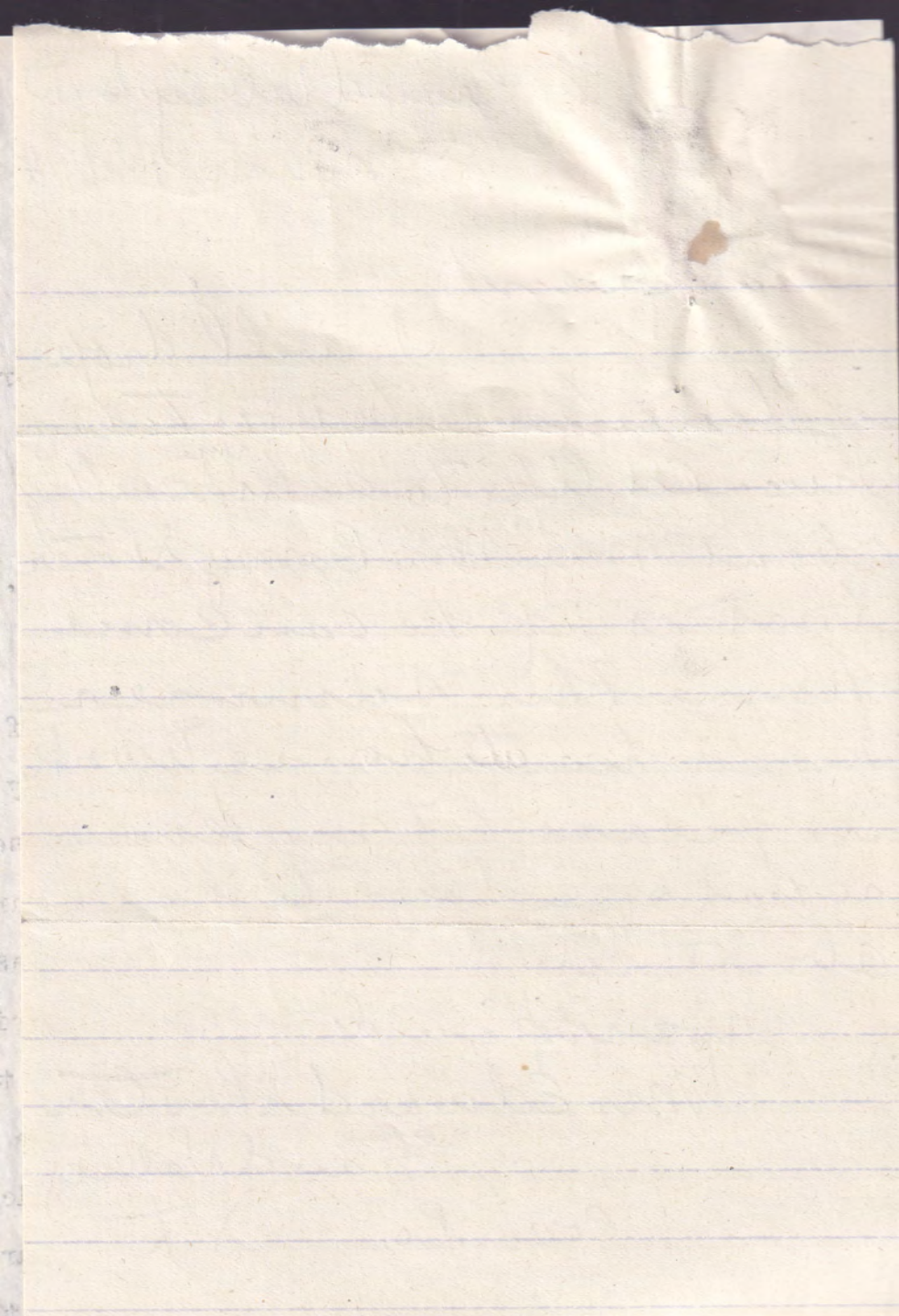

Transportation for his passage to Morrystown will be procured for his use and he should arrive there about midnight on Saturday night of this week. If he cannot make the connections scheduled he will probably arrive at Morrystown about Sunday noon, the 20th.

In this connection I will add that Barney has had considerable trouble during the summer with swollen glands of the neck and that his return home is being effected so that he can make an effort to regain his strength by spending more of his time in the open air.



He has three options, all cash, all heifers, or what is termed "regular" that is a team of brood mares, a couple of milk cows with calves, harness, wagon, &c. He has chosen the first. I would appreciate it very much if you would give me your opinion as to the wisdom of his choice. Also kindly advise me on what he based his decision.

Dear Mr. Kneale:

When the request contained in your letter of Aug. the 6th was brought to the attention of Barney Shooter he declared that he selected "all cash" for his Sioux benefits because he does not want to do the work necessary to care for any stock that would have been issued to him if he had selected one of the other kinds of benefits.

Barney has a very poor command of English and it is to be doubted whether he has the training and ability required to receive any real benefit from what would be given to him other than cash. For the reasons given it is my opinion that for Barney it will be to his advantage to receive "all cash" for his benefits.

In this connection I beg leave to report that he has had trouble for some time with supurating tubercular glands and it has been recommended by our School Physician that he be given permission to return home. Believing that Barney

himself should pay for the expense of such a trip I would thank you to advise me whether he has any funds to his credit that could be used for such a purpose. He has about \$30.00 to his credit in our school bank that could be used as part payment of his transportation expenses.
