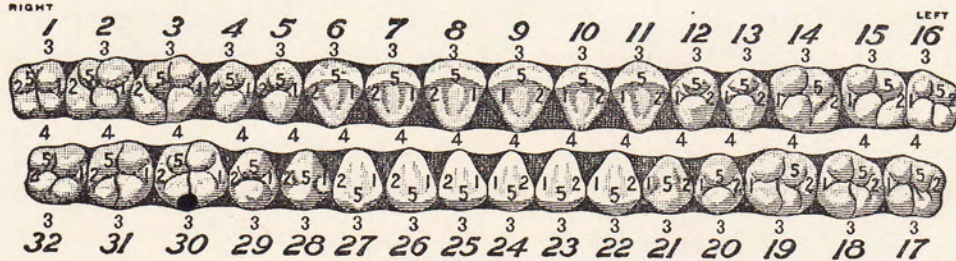

My dear Sir:

This is to acknowledge receipt of your favor of May the 8th, containing the request that your son Arthur be given permission to return home to assist you with your farm work. Replying thereto I have to advise that Arthur's period of enrolment terminates at the close of this school year and he will then be entitled to go home at Government expense. If he is to return home before that time it will be required that you pay for his transportation.

An amount of about \$50.00 would be sufficient to pay for his trip and if you send me that sum arrangements will be made at once to have him start home.
