I further say that the said child was born at Indian Falls on 1893; that the father, Charles Clute, a full Indian of the Senequa Tribe located at Yonawanda Agency; that he left the tribe about 10 yrs. is dead; that the mother, Phoebe Sundown, a full Indian of the Senequa Tribe located at Yonawanda Agency, and left the tribe about 12 yrs.; that the said child was born and reared in the United States, and now actually resides therein; and that he has attended the following schools:

INDORSEMENT.

A child showing one-sixteenth or less Indian blood, whose parents live on an Indian reservation, Indian fashion, who, if debarred from the Government schools, could not obtain an education, may be permitted in the reservation day and boarding schools, but it is preferable that it be not transferred to a nonreservation school, without permission from the Office. Children showing one-eighth or less Indian blood, whose parents do not live on an Indian reservation, whose home is among white people where there are churches and schools, who are presumed to have adopted the white man's manners and customs, and are to all intents and purposes white people, are debarred from enrollment in the Government nonreservation and reservation schools. Superintendents, in all cases where doubt exists as to the degree of Indian blood of a child proposed for transfer, should fully satisfy themselves of the facts by affidavits from reliable persons, which affidavits must be kept on file at the school.

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other non-reservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

A pupil dismissed from school for cause must not be enrolled in any other school without the permission of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs. Full facts must be submitted with each request.

This appears to be a good home governed by Christian patrons and the surroundings are desirable both as to convenience and morals.

I did not meet Mr. Heasley but the wife seems agreeable and shows a disposition to do right by her boys. She is a little hard of hearing and I take her to be a woman of quick temper but of good judgement.

Levi reports well concerning his patrons and mentioned the fact that she would sometimes allow her temper to get up; but he agreed with me that it was mostly due to deafness and lack of understanding.

Mrs. Heasley acknowledges the above fact and seems ready at once to apologize after a little fit of passion.

Mrs. Heasley wishes to have Levi remain this summer and do farm work. Will pay him \$10.00 to begin with and promote him according to his worth. Levi is also content to remain.

They also want another boy to do house work about 12 yrs of age. Only a boy of good morals is desired. Morals is in preference to skill. Will pay from \$5 to \$6 as per boy with proper provision.

Levi asks to draw $\frac{1}{2}$ his money and leave it with his patrons for winter use. He claims his clothes are too scant unless some extra provision is made.
