SPECIAL NOTE.

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a non-reservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the Agency records. The agent will then send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

NOTE.—Age limits, fourteen to twenty years. Preferably fourteen to eighteen. Students must be at least one-fourth Indian, preferably full Indian. Special cases beyond the age limit will be given consideration. An industrial course only can be taken and the term reduced to three years, in exceptional cases.

INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them is living, and if neither of them is living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, that hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

The rules provide that—

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations or Indian schools to nonreservation schools.

Answering your letter of May 18th, concerning Thomas Sheldon, I have to advise that the father of Thomas Sheldon is a white man, Ezra Sheldon, who makes his home in the vicinity of Kennewick, Washington. I do not know just what Ezra Sheldon's physical condition is, but prior to the receipt of your letter I saw Thomas Sheldon's brother Albert and his sister Mrs. Ingle and at that time they said nothing that would lead me to believe that the father was ill. I will, however, at once write to Mrs. Ingle and ascertain definitely her father's condition and advise you further. My idea at this time is that Thomas Sheldon's presence is not needed here so far as his father is concerned. His father does not make his home here at all.

Dear Mr. Lipps:-

Sheldon wrote you this morning stating that he was leaving Mount Hermon. He was careless in the observance of the rule about the use of tobacco. I talked with him very definitely about the matter when he came. He told me that he did not have any tobacco and that he had not used any since leaving Carlisle. We found, however, in spite of the pledge which he had signed before leaving Carlisle, that he purchased tobacco on the way, and used the same, that he had tobacco when he came here, and that he gave it to some of the other students in the school. He was so untruthful about the whole matter that the committee did not feel justified in encouraging him to remain. The option was given him of withdrawing voluntarily, or meeting the committee. He preferred to withdraw. Crane did not wish to remain if Sheldon went away. Accordingly both of them left Mount Hermon this afternoon, planning to return at once to Carlisle. We advanced each one of them \$13.- on their account.

I am greatly disappointed that Sheldon was so careless about his pledge, and also about the statement of the truth when he first came, and then later on in the more recent interviews. He seemed like a good fellow, and I regret that it was not possible to retain him here in the school. I hope that the experience will really be a helpful one to him disappointing as it is at present.




